Fishing results with the new Red Neck have been especially pleasing on bright, sunny days where the high visibility colour literally glows like a neon sign, triggering immediate feeding activity from any pelagic species in the vicinity.

This fantastic new colour pattern is available in the Laser Pro 190, 160 & 120 range along with the recently released Max bibless minnow.

Other changes made to Halco's range for the 2008/09 season include the expansion of the very popular R32 Natural Wonder through the entire Scorpion range as well as its addition to the Night Walker, Night Walker Nano and Relik Doc models.
