The recently released Night Walker Nano has been a dynamite little lure during this time, taking many nice fish as pictured hereabouts. Anglers across the country have found many uses for the tiny lure, especially in skinny, ultra clear waters. Bass and Bream have been especially receptive to the slow retrieve, wide action of the lure.

Long time Halco supporter Chris Tan from Malaysia has featured strongly in Newsreel over the years and this year looks to be no exception. On a recent trip Chris looks to have snagged yet another world record Toman, this time on the 6kg line class. Caught on a Tilsan Barra in Gold Herring T110 colours, this stunningly marked specimen was weighed as per the International Game Fishing Association world record requirements and then very sportingly released back into the waters it was caught from. Should the 5kg fish be ratified by the IGFA, Chris will have the All tackle, 3kg and 6kg line class records to his name— a fantastic achievement.
